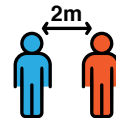




• GENERAL •

BASIC MEASURES

- ✓ The virus can easily be deactivated with soap or disinfectant.
- ✓ Frequent hand washing, between each horse, when changing rooms, when arriving and leaving the facility is necessary.
- ✓ Wearing a mask or face covering is recommended when you are in public spaces and when physical distancing is not possible. However, you do not have to wear it if it interferes with your ability to breathe during physical activity.
- ✓ Respect social distancing measures (2 m).
- ✓ Apply respiratory etiquette (cough and sneeze into your elbow).
- ✓ Observe and if you present any symptoms of COVID-19, do not show up at the stable.



ANIMALS

- ✓ As of today, there is no evidence of animal to human transmission of COVID-19.
- ✓ Be aware that animals exposed to the virus, by a sick person, may in theory be a passive vector of the virus in a transitory way.

RECOMMENDED PRODUCTS

- Alcohol-based solution containing at least 60% of alcohol
- Bleach-based solution (1 part bleach : 9 parts water)
- Over the counter cleaning products containing hydrogen peroxide

• STABLE OWNERS AND EMPLOYEES •

Currently only autonomous clients are admitted to the stable.

GENERAL

- ✓ Respect social distancing measures during work periods.
 - Limit the number of people present for each work period ;
 - Establish a schedule that ensures different work teams will not meet ;
 - Identify a team of people for replacements.
- ✓ Schedule frequent washing and disinfection of surfaces, especially those that are touched often.
- ✓ Wash or brush surfaces to remove all organic matter before disinfecting them.
- ✓ Avoid sharing your cleaning equipment with clients or service providers.

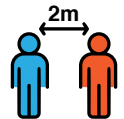


USE OF SCHOOL HORSES

- ✓ Interpose the use of school horses with a period to wash the equipment and the horse with adapted products that do not produce undesirable effects on the horse.
- ✓ Using the same school horse more than once in a day must be done with caution.

ACTIVITIES

- ✓ There cannot be more than 3 ridden or driven horses for free practice, supervised or not, at the same time in a given space and there must always be 2 m between them. It is possible to have a higher number of horses if the riders or drivers reside at the same address.

• SERVICE PROVIDERS PRESENT AT THE STABLE •

VETERINARY DOCTOR, FARRIER, DELIVERY PERSON

BEFORE

- ✓ Only priority services are allowed and only by appointment.
- ✓ Make sure to limit the number of service providers by time slot. In doubt, do not give access to a service provider.
- ✓ Choose a work space for the service provider; ideally this space is close to the door, clean and well lit.
- ✓ Open gates and doors in advance if weather permits it and bring the horse(s) that will be receiving the service close to the work space.
- ✓ Prepare the horse with its halter while avoiding touching the horse's body. Its lead chain must hang close to the box door if the service provider needs to manipulate the horse.

DURING

- ✓ Minimize the number of people present at the stable while the service provider is present.
- ✓ The service provider must have access to a sanitary station or an alcohol-based solution for hand-washing upon arrival, between each horse and before leaving the stable.
- ✓ Prioritize the exchange of digital documents.

AFTER

- ✓ Clean and disinfect the work space as well as all surfaces that may have been touched by the service provider.

• CLIENTS PRESENT AT THE STABLE BY APPOINTMENT •

Currently only autonomous clients are admitted to the stable.

TRANSPORT TO AND FROM THE STABLE

- ✔ Avoid making stops on the commute from your residence to the stable and from the stable back to your residence.

HAND HYGIENE

- ✔ Do not use gloves, hand washing is more effective. If you do not have access to a sanitary station, a disinfectant may be used.
 - Avoid touching a horse without first washing your hands ;
 - Wash your hands after manipulating a horse ;
 - Avoid touching other animals (horses, cats, etc.).
- ✔ Do not touch your face (be especially mindful if you wear glasses or a hat).

EQUIPMENT

- ✔ Use only your personal equipment, and only for your horse(s).
- ✔ Thoroughly wash your personal grooming equipment before and after using it especially if it has been used or will be used by stable employees. If you deem it necessary or if you are asked, bring the required material (halter, lead chain, broom, alcohol-based vaporising spray, etc.).

ENGAGEMENT

- ✔ Respect your engagement with the stable manager by respecting the schedule and space assigned to you as well as the planned activity and be careful.
- ✔ Do not smoke without first washing your hands and do so only outside the barn.
- ✔ Use your cell phone for emergencies only and preferably outside the barn.
- ✔ Do not bring your dog.
- ✔ You must consult and obtain permission from the stable owner when using the services of a priority service provider such as a farrier or a veterinary doctor for your horse(s).



• USE OF TRAILS OFF THE PREMISES OF THE BOARDING FACILITY •

Currently only autonomous clients are admitted to the stable. The driver and helper must reside at the same address.

TRANSPORTATION

- ✓ At this moment, horse transport intended for equestrian activities is not permitted. Only people with a direct access to trails from the horse boarding facility can have access.

NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS

- ✓ A group of 3 riders/drivers can circulate on trails. However, these people must have access to the barn without exceeding the facility's maximum number of people allowed at one time.
- ✓ Passengers of a horse-drawn vehicle must reside at the same address.

SECURITY

- ✓ One member of the group should have in his or her possession a first aid kit containing, among other elements, masks and gloves.
- ✓ Security instructions from the *Code d'éthique du cavalier-randonneur* should be applied :

USE OF TRAILS

- Group activities and treks are prohibited ;
- Gatherings are prohibited ;
- Overtaking is allowed as long as the 2 m distancing measures are applied ;
- Participants must not show up at an equestrian facility other than the one where their horses are boarded ;
- Bathrooms and rest areas of any kind must not be used ;
- Members of a group must respect a minimum distance of 2 m with each other and a distance of 50 m should separate different groups (except when overtaking or crossing) ;
- Trail maintenance equipment must not be used without permission ;
- Dogs are prohibited on trails.
